



Catholic Values and 'British Values'

St Johns is a Catholic school which seeks to live out the values of Jesus Christ. We promote these values by our words and deeds, Catholic doctrine and practice which permeates every aspect of the school's life. We provide a Catholic curriculum, which is broad and balanced, recognising that every pupil is unique and created in the image of God (Gen 1:27). Our curriculum is designed to enable every pupil to discern their vocation and to be well- equipped to become active citizens in service to the world. Catholic Religious Education is the "core of the core curriculum" (Pope St John Paul II) and the foundation of the entire educational process. We also provide a wide range of extra- curricular activities and strong pastoral support. We incorporate democratic principles, value the rule of law, support individual liberty and foster a community in which different faiths and beliefs are respected.

Religious Education enables pupils to think for themselves about British values. The subject offers opportunities to build an accurate knowledge base about religions and beliefs in relation to values. This in turn supports children and young people so that they are able to move beyond attitudes of tolerance towards increasing respect, so that they can celebrate diversity.

MUTUAL RESPECT

- The School Mission Statement which celebrates the sacredness of each individual is inclusive. All policies in the school are based on its precepts
- Respect for each other is constantly promoted through Religious Education , Prayer and Worship and the Catholic Life of the school
- Anti-Bullying and Cyberbullying are explored each year in EPR
- The school supports charitable works and the common good through fundraising for Mission Together, CAFOD and Fairtrade

TOLERANCE OF THOSE WITH DIFFERENT FAITHS AND BELIEFS

- Religious Education provides pupils with a deep understanding of their own faith as well as awareness of the faith and traditions of other religious communities as a basis for understanding and respecting them
