



## Remote learning protocol

This information is intended to provide clarity to pupils and parents/carers about what to expect from remote education, where national or local restrictions require entire cohorts/bubbles to remain at home.

### **What is taught to pupils at home?**

If an entire cohort/bubble is to isolate the children will be provided with 4 lessons a day. Teachers will pre-record lessons for their class and work will be set and placed on the year group tile on the school app.

If a child is having to self-isolate work will be provided by the class teacher in the form of a timetable. Work will be sent home every couple of days. Work will be emailed out to individual families.

We will offer the same curriculum remotely as we are teaching in school.

### **Study time each day**

Each child will be provided with 4 separate lessons a day during their time at home. These lessons will have all the relevant attached documentation for the children to access at home. The teacher, will of course, provide explanation for the child on how to complete their learning at home.

### **How will my child access online remote education?**

If the whole bubble is to isolate then the class teacher will provide pre-recorded lessons for the children to access at home. Relevant activities and work sheets will be included daily for the children to complete. All children will have access to these 'live' lessons and they can then email their class teacher for feedback.

If a child is to self-isolate when the rest of the class is in school the class teacher will provide a timetable for the child and subsequent worksheets/activities to be worked on at home. Pre-recorded lessons will not be possible as the class teacher will be face to face teaching with the remainder of the children.

Work will be uploaded to the class tiles and a link sent via email to parents so that they can access the remote learning on offer.

### **How will my child be supported if we cannot access remote learning?**

We recognise that some of our children may not have suitable online access at home.

Parents are asked to contact the school office should they need any support with remote learning. We are continuing to provide printed materials for those who need it as well as providing re-conditioned laptops for those families who might need a device to use.

All children can upload work, via email, to their class teachers.

### **Engagement and feedback**

We have been very clear, in recent months, that we are fully aware of the differing circumstances our families are facing during these most difficult of times. Therefore, we have reassured our parents/carers that we are not expecting every piece of work to be sent into school, this is not a realistic expectation to have. We are grateful for all their support, for the school and more importantly, their children.

#### **How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work?**

Class teachers will keep records of pupil engagement. If there are concerns of any sort these will be followed up with an email or a phone call by either the class teacher or learning mentor. Any further concerns will be referred to the Acting Head teacher.

#### **How will you assess my child's work and progress?**

Feedback can take many different forms and may not always mean extensive written comments. Teachers will comment on work sent in and where possible, give more detailed and constructive feedback.

#### **How will the school support parents to help their children with additional needs?**

We recognise that some pupils, for example those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), may not be able to access remote education without support from adults at home.

We will support these families in the following ways

- . Make regular contact with parent/carers
- . Provide specialist work for those children
- . Those children with 1:1 support will receive pre-recorded videos
